

ATTACHMENT AND MATERNAL CARE Experts and mother's perspective and dyadic behavior in Peruvian context

To compare expert's ideal, mother's ideal and behavior of attachment and maternal care

METHOD Participants

18 experts:

 8 teachers, 4 psychologist, 4 health worker 1 social worker and 1 anthropologist.



✓ 30 mother – child dyads

- 17 boys and 13 girls from 3 to 5 years old
- Mothers are from 25 to 45 years old
- They attained at least high school education
- Middle socioeconomic status


Measures

- Attachment Q Set 3.0 version AQS (Waters, 1995) Inter-rater reliability: .76
- Maternal Behavior for Preschoolers Q Sort MBPQS (Posada, Kaloustain, Richmond & Moreno, 2007) Inter-rater reliability: .74

They described ideal secure child and sensitive mother.

 Mothers described ideal secure child and sensitive mother Mothers and children were observed: Two observations of one hour each (Free mother-child interaction at home, a story reading task and free mother child interaction at playground).

Experts (ideal): .79 Mothers (ideal): .84 SIM PCM SIM: Smooth interactions with mothers PCM: Physical contact with mothe Experts (ideal): .83

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CHI: Contribution harmonious interaction

SUP: Supervision LS: Limit setting
